MAQ Grant Application and Toowoomba Languages and Cultures (TLC) Festival 2010:



TIMS was again successful in its application for \$11,000 grant from Multicultural Affairs Queensland (MAQ). TIMS and the Festival Committee were honoured to play host to *Their Excellencies The Governor-General Ms Quentin Bryce and Mr Michael Bryce* when they accepted our invitation to open the festival. The Governor-General also said that she appreciated and admired the work being done by the Toowoomba Regional Council, TIMS and the all the organisations that worked together to organise the Festival to make Toowoomba a more inclusive and cohesive community.

The grant enabled us to partner with the Toowoomba Regional Council through their Multicultural Officer Elizabeth Jones, Modern Languages Teachers Association of Qld, Lifeline, Mercy Family Services, University of Southern Queensland, Refugee and Migrant Support Services Interchange, Cultural Diversity Network, and many cultural groups in the region to organise the Fifth Toowoomba Languages and Cultures Festival on 8 August. The event was the biggest and best ever with many groups participating for the first time. TIMS submitted the acquittal report to the Minister for Multicultural Affairs Qld on 30 Aug 2010.
