MAQ Grant - TLC Festival 2011:

TIMS was again successful in its application for \$11,000grant from Multicultural Affairs Queensland (MAQ) for the sixth Toowoomba Languages and Cultures Festival on 14 August. This year's festival was the biggest so far with over 60 displays, 3 stages with 55 performances, 25 food stalls. Over 12,000 people attended the event. (See tims.org.au for the photographs). TIMS is one the major sponsors of the event. This year we donated \$16,000 to the event. TIMS members also played a major role in helping the TLC Festival Committee. Ms Trudy Moses was the volunteer coordinator, Ms Daphne Fung coordinated the Health Expo (see below) while Ms Taisoo Kim Watson and Ms Gitie House coordinated the performances and were emcees on the main stage. Gitie is also the Chair of the TLC Festival committee and to Mr Louis Geist for helping at the TLC Voluneteers Stand.

Health & Wellness Expo at the TLC Festival:

The Third TIMS Health & Wellness Expo was held in conjunction and as a part of the TLC Festival this year. The event attracted over 25 health stalls. Stallholders sent unsolicited praises to *Ms Daphne Fung* who coordinated the expo expressing their desire to return, bring their colleagues and expand their displays in 2012.
