ABC Open Video Workshops

ABC Open producer Mr Ben Tupas ran the first round of the two day intensive workshops for TIMS in March this year. Participants learned how to use and care for the HD digital SLR equipment along with filming techniques and the use of editing software. Members Ms Estela Estoria, Mr Roberto Garcia, Mrs Preeti Parikh, Mr Ron House and Mrs Gitie House produced ABC TV quality videos on 'Life's Big Questions' which are now published on the ABC Open website and Vimeo . Stress Management Workshops
