Toowoomba's Scottish Heritage was celebrated with feature performances by the Toowoomba Caledonian Society & Pipe Band, Bernadette's School of Highland Dancing and the McGrath School of Highland Dancing. A record number of 1170 performers gave 75+ performances from 69 cultures. A record crowd of 21,000 people attended the event.
